The quickest, easiest and cheapest way for us to get information out to you is via email and through Facebook.

If you are not receiving emails from the following city email address you are NOT included in our system. Smithfield City Communication System (communityresponse@smithfieldcity.org)

What are we asking you to do? If you want to receive emails from the city and are not receiving them. Simply send an email to communityresponse@smithfieldcity.org with your name, address and utility account number and you will be added to the system. You can submit as many different email addresses as you want and they will all be included in the system.

Please note Hotmail email addresses flag our email address as SPAM so please visit your junk folder and mark us as a safe sender.

If at any time you don't want to receive emails from the city simply click "Unsubscribe" at the bottom of any email we send you and your email address is deleted from our system.

TREE CITY USA STATUS

Spring is my favorite season of the year. The way plants come out of hibernation, turn green again and produce beautiful bouquets of flowers. It is a new awakening and a rebirth of the earth. Dormant trees produce buds and new leaves and produce beautiful fragrant blossoms. Trees make our city esthetically pleasing and add to its' ultimate beauty. Smithfield has maintained a Tree City USA status for 24 years. 2018 will be our 25th year. To qualify for this status we must have a five member board which meets at least six months during the year. Three board members are unable to continue to serve in this capacity, therefore the city is searching for at least three individuals who are willing to serve on this important committee. Serving on the board is voluntary.

Tree committee activities include promoting the planting of trees within the city. They sponsor an arbor day poster contest with the three elementary schools in Smithfield and invite the student winners to participate in a tree planting in celebration of arbor day. The committee makes recommendations to the city where and what variety of trees to plant within the city. A tree inventory has been completed on all lands owned by the city including all trees growing on main street, 100 North, 100 East and 100 West. They applied to the Utah division of state lands and forestry to list three trees in Smithfield as Big Trees. We now have three Trees all within the boundaries of Smithfield cemetery which hold the state record for size. A large Norway Spruce is one of them. You will see the committee promoting trees at their booth during health days at Forester Acres where they have a free drawing each year. The committee also promotes memorial tree plantings at Smithfield nature park near Mack Park.

Kindergarten registration for the 2018-19 school year will be held for all three Smithfield elementary schools on **Wednesday, March 14th** (8:00 am to 3:00 pm) and **Thursday, March 15th** (1:00 pm to 7:00 pm). These are the dates that essential documents will be received and student assessments will be administered.

- Fill out the short pages of information 1 - 9. Pages 6 and 7 are read only.
- Where a signature is requested, please type in your name and the date.
- Select [Proceed to Step 3](#).
- Here you will find information concerning what you need to provide to the school. Busing information and Free/Reduced lunch applications are also located here.

Please bring your child to the school they will be attending for their assessment. It is also essential to bring your child's original **birth certificate and proof of immunizations**. Your child should receive all necessary immunizations before registration. You must also bring a **valid driver's license or government issued ID** and **2 proofs of residency**.
