## Rules:

1. Hen chickens (no roosters) regardless of age, may be kept on a lot or parcel of land in a residential ( R ) zone, with the exception of the multiple family residential zone (RM).
2. It shall be unlawful for any person to keep any chicken in a residential zone in a manner contrary to the provisions of Chapter 17.12.230 of the Municipal Code.
3. Chickens shall be confined within a secure outdoor enclosed area which shall include a covered, ventilated, and predator resistant chicken coop.

## Coop Requirements:

1. The coop shall have a minimum floor area of at least two (2) square feet per chicken.
2. If chickens are not allowed to roam within an enclosed area outside the coop, the coop shall have a minimum floor area of six (6) square feet per chicken.
3. The coop shall be located in a rear yard at least twenty-five feet ( $25^{\prime}$ ) from any dwelling located on an adjacent lot and that there be a three-foot ( $3^{\prime}$ ) setback between the property line and the coop.
4. The coop and enclosed area shall be maintained in a neat and sanitary condition.
5. No chicken shall be permitted to roam outside the enclosed area and/or coop if there is no enclosed area.
6. Chicken feed shall be stored and dispensed in rodent proof and predator proof containers.
