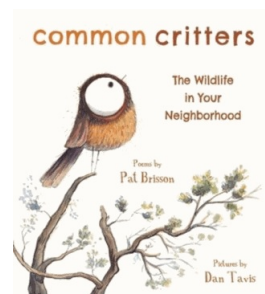
Haven by Emma Donoghue
